HOW TO APPLY

1. Email proof of service (e.g. MPRR, Certificate of Service, CAF ID) to info@roninrescue.com with an expression of interest, along with your Name, Address, and Phone number

2. If your application is accepted, a representative from Ronin Rescue will confirm your acceptance.

3. Your information will be forwarded to SMART Fire. They will then contact you to complete payment and registration

Please keep in mind that registration is not complete until payment has been received and confirmed by SMART Fire

What is NFPA 1001, Level 1 and 2? This is the National Fire Protection Association Standard for Professional Firefighters and is the minimum required level of training for many fire departments in Canada and the United States.

Who is running the program? The program is being run by SMART Fire in conjunction with Training Division. Ronin Rescue is providing the skills based instruction for the program.

What is different about this program? This serial of the program is only being offered to current or former service members of the Canadian Forces or Allied Forces. Many Ronin staff have served in the US, Canadian, British, Belgian and Australian Armed Forces. Many of these individuals are now firefighters and will be able to give you a S#\$T – NO S#\$T assessment of transitioning from the Forces to 1 CIV DIV, especially the Fire Service.

Where is the course being held? The course is being held in Surrey, BC, Canada.

How long is the course? The course is 10 straight days of skills training. The student must complete the online portion prior to attending the class.

What do I need? To pick up the workbooks, a pair of blue pants (or two), black steel toed boots and a good attitude. SMART Fire will have a list of other small items you will require.

Is food and accommodation provided? No, the students are responsible for their own food and accommodations. SMART Fire has a list of Air BnB's locally that students have stayed in during the program.

Do I have to finish the online portion prior to attending the skills portion? Yes, completion of the online portion is a pre-requisite for the skills portion of the program.
